	<p>Explain the learning. Mouth exercises...</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Sing and bounce the b-b-b-b. 2. Hold up the Picture - Sound card of the sound. Say the words: b-b-boot b-b-ball, b-b-bicycle, b-b-b-bag 3. Show the Picture- Sound card again. Run your finger down the boot, over the top and under to the heel saying b-b-b-b. <p>The picture of the b-b-b-b sound is on the slide. Can you have a go at this again?</p>	<p>In the story 'Can't You Sleep Little Bear?', the two Bears leave the cave to see the moon. I wonder how many steps they climb to get outside.</p> <p>Can you count how many stairs there are in your house?
